Annual Update to the Town Council from Yountville Arts for 2020

#### DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND

In 2020 the Yountville Arts Commission had to pivot some of its programming due to the pandemic. That meant holding literary programs on Zoom, converting Art Sip & Stroll to a virtual event and, when we were finally able to open the gallery in September, staggering visitors to no more than four in a single-family unit at a time.

Of course, the Art Walk never shuts down. We installed nine new sculptures on the Art Walk last year and five already since the beginning of 2021. Of note is the YES School Book which was unveiled in front of Town Hall on October 15. Kim Cook, our vice-chair, spearheaded a long process working with the school, Council members Durham and Dorenbecher and the Arts Commission. The sculpture was made possible by the support of community members, businesses, school families, Kiwanis Club of Yountville, the YES PTA and the Town.

We did sell nine pieces off the Art Walk last year and another since the beginning of 2021. Obviously, artists are happy with their exposure in Yountville as well as the sales we generate. The Art Walk subcommittee keeps busy identifying artists and securing their work for public display. And the Art Walk Audio Tour continues to get use with an added mapping capability.

The Gallery at the Community Center put on three shows with opening nights. There was a normal reception for the "Contemporary Tapestry" of Napa artist Sharon Crary in the first quarter—she demonstrated weaving on her small loom at the opening. Then the gallery went dark with the pandemic from April through early September. It reopened with paintings of St. Helena artist Marvin Humphrey in the fall, and ended with the paintings, drawings and collages of long-time Napa artist Maash Pascal at year's end. All the shows led to gallery sales with a total of 14 for the year. We try to focus on local artists, and two months from now will unveil an exhibit entitled "Yountville Artists x 3".

The Literary Subcommittee delayed Yountville Out Loud until September and switched it to a Zoom format. One of the speakers was our own Marianne Lyon who's on track to become the Napa County Poet Laureate.

Additionally, two book events held in July were also switched from live in the Community Hall to Zoom. These were our first partnerships with the Napa Bookmine. The first was "San Francisco Year Zero" by Lincoln Mitchell about 1978: the Moscone/Milk murders, Jonestown Temple massacre and a third place Giants team. The second was Katy Butler's "The Art of Dying Well" that generated an especially positive response in our town.

The 8th annual Art, Sip & Stroll hosted fifty artists in what became a virtual arts festival as part of Arts in April. This year it will be held in June. Higher quality artists continue to join us. We're hoping to hold an outdoor event with proper precautions.
