

PROCLAMATION

In Remembrance of The Pathway Home's Three Brave Women

WHEREAS, for more than a decade, The Pathway Home non-profit organization provided educational, professional and clinical support in a residential setting to post-9/11 veterans who were pursuing academic or vocational opportunities while they transitioned back into civilian life following their military deployment.

WHEREAS, located on CalVet's Yountville Veterans Home campus, The Pathway Home included programs and services that supported military veterans who struggled with mental and emotional challenges, including Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), among other clinical conditions.

WHEREAS, a little more than three years ago, on the morning of March 9, 2018, a gunman broke into the Pathway Home facility, took staff and members hostage, and later shot and killed Dr. Jennifer Gray Golick, Executive Director Christine Loeber and Dr. Jennifer Gonzales Shushereba, before killing himself.

WHEREAS, these three brave women committed their professional careers to serving veterans who needed the specialized care and personal attention they provided. Each of the women had a profound impact in their industry, and each also left a lasting impression throughout our Napa Valley community.

NOW, THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED, that I, John F. Dunbar, Mayor of the Town of Yountville, along with the Town Council, as we approach the third anniversary of their passing, hereby honor Dr. Jennifer Gray Golick, Executive Director Christine Loeber, and Dr. Jennifer Gonzales Shushereba and the legacy of compassion, professionalism and commitment to serving others that is memorialized by the way they lived their professional and personal lives.
