Project Status Update for Public Works Projects Fiscal Year 2022/2023

DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND

The mission of the Town of Yountville Public Works Department is to provide beautiful parks, safe streets, and high-quality water and wastewater treatment while creating an inviting public environment to both live and visit. The Public Works staff accomplishes this mission by providing great public service and overseeing the maintenance, repair and operation of public facilities and infrastructure.

Public Works projects can be split into two broad categories:

- 1. Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Projects
- 2. Minor Construction Projects

The CIP projects are the large Public Works projects that are budgeted each year as part of the Town's 5-year Capital Improvement Plan. Projects are selected based on priority, need, and available funding sources. These various projects are organized into seven different project areas: Civic Facilities Projects, Community Projects, Drainage and Flood Control Projects, Parks and Recreation Projects, Streets and Transportation Projects, Wastewater and Water Reclamation Projects, and Water Distribution Projects. The CIP projects that were recently constructed or are in active construction include (in no particular order):

- MT 3023- Measure T Road Rehabilitation Project:
- WA 0021-Relocation of Harvest Ct. Fire Hydrant:

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Minor construction projects are selected based on priority, need, community input and available funding. These projects are much smaller in scope and cost and can typically be completed within one fiscal year. These minor construction projects are also a method the Town utilizes to address resident concerns. Residents will reach out to Town staff regarding various issues such as displaced sidewalks, potential bicyclist and pedestrian obstacles,

or damaged infrastructure. The Public Works Department will evaluate the concern and determine the best way to address it. At times, this will result in a minor construction project. The minor construction projects that were recently constructed include:

- Guard Rail Repair on Yount Mill Rd.:
- ADA Ramp and Path Repairs

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 Angled Parking at Community Center & Striped Bulbout at Yountville Cross Rd.
