Second Reading and Adoption of Ordinance 21-501 Amending Titles 6 (Animals), 12 (Streets, Sidewalks, Public Places and Parks), 15 (Buildings and Construction), 16 (Subdivisions), and 17 (Zoning), and Repealing Title 18 (Design Standards) of the Yountville Municipal Code

DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND

On August 3, 2021, the Town Council unanimously voted to introduce and waive the first reading of Ordinance 21-501, which substantially amends Title 17 (Zoning), repeals Title 18 (Design Standards), and incorporates the design standards into Title 17, with associated revisions to Title 6 (Animals), Title 12 (Streets, Sidewalks, Public Places and Parks), Title 15 (Buildings and Construction), and Title 16 (Subdivisions). The motion to introduce the ordinance included direction to make the following changes, summarized here and highlighted in yellow in the attached Ordinance:

- Page 26 (RS district), page 28 (RM district), and page 32 (H district): edit the "Height Limit" row of the general development standards tables to clarify that the "50% rule" limits the number of structures that exceed one-story. This change establishes a maximum one-story building height of 20 feet for purposes of classifying when the exception provisions apply.
- Page 43 (PF district) and page 46 (PC district): provided notation that "the Town Council may
 provide examples of what might constitute a substantial community benefit by resolution" to
 put applicants on notice of additional uncodified requirements related to the third story height
 bonus.
- Page 129: modified the parking requirement for emergency shelters consistent with the proposed revision verbally presented at the meeting.
- Page 144: added a new provision that murals are subject to advisory review by the Arts Commission prior to consideration and decision by the Zoning and Design Review Board.
- Page 154: clarified that one of the exception categories is to the "limits on the number" of structures in residential districts that are permitted to exceed one story.

Both the clean version and the underline-strikeout version of the Ordinance are attached. Please note that there are many minor grammar, format and reference number corrections in the clean version that do not appear in the underline-strikeout version. This is because the need for the changes was only identified in the final review of the clean version.

The Ordinance is now before the Town Council for a second reading and adoption and will take effect thirty (30) days after the date of adoption.
